

The City of Hudson's Snow Emergency is law!

Please familiarize yourself with the procedures, as your cooperation is not only appreciated, but essential!

SNOW EMERGENCY PLAN - commonly asked questions:

1. How will I know when it's a snow emergency?

Check the city of Hudson website at cityofhudson.org. Announcements will also be made on Local radio stations and Local TV stations. Call City Hall at 518-828-9458 for more information.

2. What do I do next?

Proceed to move your vehicle to the side it belongs under the standard alternate street parking regulations at 12:00 AM midnight.

(Example: on December 2nd a Snow Emergency is called at 8:00 AM, you would need to move your vehicle at that time to the ODD side of the street. As the standard alternate side street parking regulations would require this as of midnight for the 3rd of December, you will just be moving your vehicle earlier than normal.)

3. How long do I leave my vehicle on each side of the street?

You can move your vehicle at any time, however, if you choose to leave it parked, it **must** be moved 24 hours from the time the Emergency was called.

(Example: If the emergency was called at 8:00 AM on December 2nd, you need to switch sides at 8:00 AM on December 3rd.)

After 48 hours have elapsed from the initial designated time, then the normal regulation time returns to **8:00 PM**. For those streets which park 6 nights per week (Example: Worth Avenue; Union Street from 4th to 7th streets; Parkwood Boulevard; 7th Street from Union to Warren Street; Robinson Street; McKinstry Place; Fairview Avenue from Columbia to City Line; Oakwood Boulevard; Glenwood Boulevard; Cross Street, North 6th Street from State to Washington Streets; etc.) cars will remain in place until such time as signs are posted for that side to be cleared. **AT NO TIME DURING A SNOW EMERGENCY WILL THERE BE PARKING ON 2 SIDES OF ANY STREET.**

4. What do I do about my sidewalk?

All sidewalks need to be cleared of snow and ice following all snow/ice events. Please shovel snow and ice to curb. Warren Street sidewalks are required to be shoveled 12 hours following a weather event. All other streets and boulevards have 24 hours to shovel walks.

REMEMBER, VEHICLES NOT IN COMPLIANCE WILL BE TOWED AND SUBJECT TO PENALTIES!
